OVERDOSE PREVENTION AND DISPENSING OF NALOXONE BY PHARMACISTS

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Pharmacists allowed to dispense naloxone by

- Prescription
- Collaborative practice agreements
- OHA protocols, under oversight by licensed physician or nurse practitioner

HISTORIC AVAILABILITY OF NALOXONE THROUGH PHARMACY

Introduced and passed in the 2016 Legislative Session, effective April 4, 2016.

- Expands prescribing and dispensing of single-unit naloxone to pharmacists
- Also included allowance for PDMP to interface with health information technology systems





Rules being developed by Oregon Board of Pharmacy to define process pharmacist must follow for prescription.

► In process...

SO NOW WHAT?

- Anticipate that the rule will be similar to current Oregon Health Authority statues allowing for dispensing of naloxone to members of the community who have completed naloxone use training.
- Includes anyone at risk or perceives themselves to be at risk of experiencing or witnessing opiate overdose.
- Should include any of 3 presentations of naloxone (autoinjector, intranasal kit, manufactured intranasal)
- Would expect provider notification (if known) to be a part of the recommendation
